## Our approach

Initially Adaptation Scotland and PAS worked together to develop a shared understanding of the tools and resources available through the Adaptation Scotland programme, and the range and scope of projects and programmes run by PAS.

This review process enabled PAS and Adaptation Scotland to identify immediate and longer term opportunities to integrate climate change adaptation in to PAS projects and programmes. It also highlighted opportunities for PAS to help shape new Adaptation Scotland resources.



PAS projects and programmes are supported by an extensive network of volunteers. They have a wide range of skills and expertise, and play a vital role in PAS's community engagement work.

Increasing awareness of adaptation among their volunteers was a key aim for PAS. Adaptation Scotland designed and worked with PAS to run three training events in Glasgow, Edinburgh and Dundee using Adaptation Scotland's climate ready places visuals to bring the challenge of adapting places to life. The volunteers were challenged to transform visuals of un-adapted landscapes in to climate ready places.

These sessions proved effective in raising awareness among volunteers and further increased adaptation knowledge and awareness among the PAS staff team. Participants said that the training was 'very helpful to widen knowledge' and the climate ready places activity was 'amazing, prompting good and rich discussions'.



Adaptation Scotland has used feedback from PAS staff and volunteers to further develop the Climate Ready Places visuals and has run the workshop developed for PAS volunteers as part of training for other organisations.



## Outcomes

PAS and Adaptation Scotland have developed a strong partnership and are working towards integrating adaptation as part of PAS projects and programmes. This will increase awareness among communities of local climate change impacts and, harness local knowledge to inform planning for climate ready places.

PAS is also seeking to influence its extensive network, including public bodies, charities, NGO's and private sector partners, to increase awareness of the need to adapt and, play their part in taking action.

## Next steps

PAS and Adaptation Scotland are now working to integrate adaptation into the Youth Engagement Programme, and Charretteplus® projects.

Adaptation Scotland provides advice and support to help ensure that Scotland is prepared for, and resilient to, the impacts of climate change.

## Information and support

The global climate is changing with far-reaching implications for Scotland. Greenhouse gases already emitted into the atmosphere mean that some climate change is unavoidable regardless of future emissions reductions.
